Engagement on our site continues to grow with over one million users - a 20% increase in the number of sessions and an impressive overall user satisfaction rate of 93%. Using social media as a knowledge exchange tool our followers grew by 73% and in 2019 the Health/nfoNet recorded a 2660% growth in engagement!

As an established, trusted, easily accessible resource in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health sector, and aligned with key government goals and objectives, the Health Info Net delivers results that actively supports the health workforce.
